
ROTARY STARTS THE ROAD



The Rotary Club of North Cobb has selected Mountain Top's Road for their 2018 District Grant award. The grant will support a small but critical piece of the road project - construction of a concrete pad for the Dogwood Lodge trash dumpster. The dumpster pad needs to be built before the road is blacktopped so we don't need to tear up the blacktop to build the pad.

These are the concrete pads you see in front of and under the trash corrals in most McDonalds and Wendys. The weight of the truck and the banging of the trash can to dislodge the trash create significant dynamic force. The concrete must be heavy duty to avoid the truck's front wheels tearing out the road. The concrete also avoids the risk of eroding the asphalt by hydraulic or trash "juice" leaks. We expect to have the pad done in the Fall.
